Telecommunication

Please check if your service provider has a roaming agreement with a Hong Kong operator. Pay attention to the roaming rates.

1. Travel tips to Hong Kong (cont'd)

Electrical equipment

The standard electrical voltage in Hong Kong is 220 Volts AC, 50Hz. The electrical outlets in Hong Kong take a <u>three-pronged UK-style plug</u>. Please make sure that you <u>bring along an adaptor with you</u>. You may buy an adaptors for your electrical equipment at most convenience stores.

Daily necessities

There is one supermarket—Park'n Shop—

on CUHK campus, which is about 10 minute walking distance from your dormitory. (Address: LG, John Fulton Centre. Opening hours: 8:30 am–10:00 pm (Mon–Fri) 8:30 am–9:00 pm (Sat, Sun and public holidays).

Travel Insurance

You are **strongly advised to purchase travel insurance to cover your trip** as any medical or emergency expenses incurred, if applicable, could be very expensive.

Personal belongings

You are reminded to bring along the followings:

- Identify card, passport, entry permit and travel documents, where applicable
- Personal care products such as cleaning supplies, water bottle, sunscreen product, umbrella, emergency drugs, etc
- Cash (both HK dollars and RMB): you may purchase an Octopus Card upon arrival. Octopus card is widely used in transportation, convenience stores, supermarkets, fast-food shops and retails shops in Hong Kong as well as on the CUHK campus.
- Room temperature is around 23-25 degrees in seminar rooms and other inner area of two Engineering Buildings. You may consider bringing a wind jacket with you.
- Stationeries, universal electronic adaptor and other items like flashlight

2. Arriving CUHK

You are advised to purchase an On-loan Octopus card (八達通卡). The Otocpus card is widely used in Hong Kong for paying for public transportation and for buying goods at convenience stores, supermarkets, and fast-food shops, etc.

From Hong Kong International Airport

By Taxi

It takes about 35 to 40 minutes from the airport to CUHK and the fare is approximately HKD 350-400. Taxi drivers in HK usually speak simple English and Mandarin. The Octopus card cannot be used to pay the fare. You may ask for a receipt before getting off the taxi.

Public Transport (Via Bus+ Metro)

Take the Airport Bus A41 or E42 and get off at Sha Tin Central Bus Terminus (沙田市中心總站). Afterwards, walk to Sha Tin Station (5-min walk) and take the MTR East Rail line (東鐵綫) to University Station. Visit http:// www.kmb.com.hk/en/ for more information on airport bus.

From Luo Hu Customs (罗湖口岸)

If you enter HK from Luo Hu, you will be able to see the sign "Hong Kong" and just walk though Luo Hu Customs (罗湖口岸) and arrive in Hong Kong. Take the MTR East Rail line to University Station.

From Futian, Shenzhen (福田口岸)

If you enter HK from Futian, take the MTR East Rail line at Lok Ma Chau Station (落馬洲站) to University Station (大學站).




From Hong Kong West Kowloon High Speed Rail Station (香港西九龍高鐵站)

Get off at Hong Kong West Kowloon Station.

Walk to Austin Station (柯士甸站) and travel to Hung Hom Station (紅磡站).

Take the East Rail Line (東鐵綫) from Hung Hom Station to University Station (大學站).



2. Arriving CUHK (Cont'd)

We do not have sufficient manpower to provide pick-up service from the airport; you will have to come to CUHK by yourself. CUHK is right beside the University MTR Station of the East Rail Line (東鐵線) (refer to p.14 for the MTR map). If you decide to take a taxi to CUHK, you may ask the taxi driver to take you directly to SH Ho College (善衡書院) or Morningside College (晨興書院), your dormitory for the weeklong workshop. The two Colleges are just next to each other. If the driver does not know the location, simply ask to be dropped off at the University MTR station (大學港鐵站).

3. Campus housing

You can either take school bus or walk to your dormitory.

A) School Bus

After you arrive at the University MTR Station on July 7 (Sunday), try to locate the CUHK bus stop and get on **School Bus Line H**. After getting off at the first station (University Sports Center 大學體育中心), you will be on

University Avenue and right across the street from the two Colleges. Turn right from University Avenue into a side way that leads you to the Colleges. The link below provides more information about the CUHK campus shuttles. Line H runs every 20 minutes during 8:20am—11:20pm on Sundays and public holidays: http://www.cuhk.edu.hk/transport office/



Note that Line H only runs on Sundays and Public Holidays. If you desire to explore Hong Kong on weeknights, you should take the **Bus Line 1A** instead. You still get off at the first station to return your hostel. Line 1A runs every 15-20 minutes depending on the time of the day.



Directions to hostels—by school bus




Main entrance of Morningside College (晨興書院)

B) Walking route


You can also go to the hostel on foot (10-min walk from the MTR exit).



4. Checking into campus housing

On the day of move-in, please check-in at <u>SH Ho College</u> which is located just a **10-minute walking distance from the University MTR Station on foot**. Our staff will wait for you there. **Please do not come to CUHK earlier than July 7, since housing will not be available before then.** Our preferred check-in time is between 3 PM and 6 PM. If you need to arrive earlier or later than our suggested time slot, please contact us by email (phd@erg.cuhk.edu.hk) in advance.


NOTE 1: During the check-in period, please report duty to our staff or student helper at the main entrance, G/F lobby, Ho Tim Hall Building, SH Ho College (善衡書院何添堂學生宿舍). They will pass you the room key and other accessories. Participants will stay in either SH Ho College or Morningside College.


6. Hostel Regulations

- (1) Residents should dress properly in all common areas of the College.
- (2) Residents should avoid making excessive noise in the Hostel. The period between <u>11:00 p.m. and</u> <u>7:00 a.m.</u> is regarded as the <u>Quiet Hours</u> of the Hostels. During the Quiet Hours, residents should not make or cause to be made any noise which is a source of annoyance to any person.
- (3) Residents are **NOT** allowed to enter hostel premises for the opposite sex floors from 12:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- (4) Gambling in any forms is prohibited in the premises of the Hostels. Possession of any gambling facilities is also **prohibited**.
- (5) Overnight visitor is not allowed.
- (6) Residents should not possess, store or consume hard liquor (more than 20%) in any forms in the premises of the Hostel. Drunkenness and related disorderly behaviours are regarded as misbehaviours.
- (7) **Smoking is strictly prohibited** in all hostel areas including the rooms and common areas.
- (8) Any prohibited items may be confiscated by the Warden; confiscated items will not be returned.
- (9) No cooking is allowed in Hostel rooms or common areas (except pantries) of the College.
- (10) The pantry is only for simple cooking. Residents are to clean up the pantry immediately after use.
- (11) Residents should not ignite fires or burn candles in the Hostel.
- (12) Residents should use the dryers in the laundry room to dry their clothes as far as possible.
- (13) Residents are **not** permitted to use the recreation and sport facilities of the College (e.g. Fitness Room, reading room).

Laundry at student hostels

Washing machines and drying machines are available at hostels of both SH Ho College and and Morningside College. You will have to pay the fees by Octopus Card. Cash is not accepted.



9. Getting around Hong Kong

Except the welcoming banquet and lunch arrangement on day one and day two, you are expected to take care of other meals. There are a number of canteens located in the central area and Colleges on campus. We also encourage you to take advantage of your weeklong stay to explore our vibrant city by taking MTR (see the MTR system map below). Feel free to consult our staff members or students on where you may get authentic Cantonese food or visit our famous tourist attractions in town.

A single-way train ride from University Station to Kowloon Tong Station takes about 15-20 minutes. From Kowloon Tong, you may conveniently transit to another line and head towards the heart of the city. The University MTR station closes at around 12pm mid-night.

- Turn on your Wi-Fi enabled device and detect the network SSID=CUguest
- Open your web browser and you will be prompted to enter your account.
- At "Login to CUguest Wi-Fi Service" page:
 - I. Enter your User ID as above (excluding domain name)
 - II. Select your User Category from the pull-down menu:
- III. Enter your password, and then click Login. For successful login, you'll be able to surf the web anytime at campus hotspots.
- Logout the service by clicking the Logout link that prompted on the screen. Except for 1-hour idle time disconnection, there is no connection time quota in using this service.

(2) Eduroam on CUHK campus.

Eduroam WiFi service is available on campus. If your school provides Eduroam WiFi service, logon username and password will be the same.



12. Supervisor selection and admission interview

A unique hyperlink for supervisor selection and admission interview will be sent to the email account you registered in your PHDSW application on July 3 (Tuesday). <u>Do not share</u> the hyperlink with others. Each participant can declare up to 2 intended supervisors in the online system.

The sharp deadline for submission is **23:00, 9 July 2019, Tuesday (Day 2)**. Make sure that you have made proper declaration before the deadline. Admission interviews will be conducted on July 11 (Thursday) and July 12 (Friday) respectively.

The exact interview date and time will be decided by the intended graduate divisions.



14. Medical Service
